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HIGHLIGHTS OF THE YEAR 2020

January – March 2020

HSH Internship: Playgroup

In the beginning of the year, two university students planned and organized playgroup program for 3-year-old children. The aim of the pilot program was to teach and prepare the kids to kindergarten.



April – August 2020

Construction of Kalevala Training Center

During the year, we started our collaboration with Kalevala Koru. We constructed, furnished and opened training center for girls. The aim of the project is to educate and train 16-25 years old girls and young women.



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April 2020

HSH Health Clinic

HSH Health Clinic is a pilot program of HSH Health Center project. First stage of the program was the construction of a small clinic room. Clinic room started to operate in April 2020.

By end of the pilot year, our Health Clinic had served hundreds of people.



April 2020

HSH Switzerland

During 2020, our organization took a huge step: HSH is now officially register in Switzerland. Therefore we are now working in three different countries: Kenya, Finland and Switzerland. Immediately after registration, our team HSH Switzerland started to look for sponsors, fundraise and spread the word about HSH in Switzerland.

November 2020

First opening ceremony of Kalevala Training Center

First students of Kalevala Training Center finished their course on 26th of November 2020. We organized beautiful graduation ceremony to our center. Most of them continued to practical trainings and to look for job opportunities.

Starting the foundation of HSH Day Care Center

HSH Day Care Center is a day care for children with special needs. The purpose of the project is to create a safe environment for children with special needs to learn, develop their skills and get professional support. In December 2020, our team started the foundation of the day care center.



2020 - A YEAR FULL OF SURPRISES

2020 was a year full of surprises: covid19 pandemic brought us unstable and difficult time. We needed to change our plans, reschedule programs and develop working methods. Nevertheless, our team worked hard to make sure, that all our annual targets would be met. In addition, we developed more activities which were designed to support the neediest ones and the ones who were most effected by the pandemic. For example, we organized food sharing activities, supported people with health crisis and shared hygiene products for all our HSH Trust kids.

Even though the pandemic made our work significantly harder, we had amazing and productive year. Our HSH Rescue Center project proceeded fast: We constructed kitchen building, continued with toilet building and started a dining hall building. In addition, we constructed and opened health clinic in the center as a pilot project of HSH Health Center. Our clinic started to operate and serve in April and by end of the year, over 550 people visited our clinic.

In April 2020, we started our collaboration with Kalevala Koru. During the spring and summer of 2020, with the funding of Kalevala Koru, we built and established a training center for girls and young women. Kalevala Koru is responsible for financing the project and we are handling the operational side of the project. In August, we opened the training center and first groups started their course programs. We used hours and hours to make sure, our students can have a beautiful, motivating and inspiring learning environment and all the support they need for future. KTC has been a big success!

Same time, our new team members from Switzerland registered Home Street Home there and started to spread the word, fundraise and look for partners. Therefore, we are officially working in three different countries: Kenya, Finland and Switzerland. In December, through the funding of HSH Switzerland, we started to construct HSH Day Care building. The purpose of the project is to create and safe environment for children with special needs to learn, develop their skills and get professional support. By end of the year, we finished the foundation of the main building.

In addition, because of covid19, most of the international volunteers and students rescheduled or canceled their trips. Still, during the difficult months, new local members joined our team. Therefore, we used time and resources to build and focus on our local team. We organized team trainings: First aid course, occupation safety training, team skill day and hours of working and brainstorming together. We wanted to make sure, that through this pandemic, we will grow stronger and more receptive, in a way that even worldwide pandemic cannot stop us.

By the end of the year 2020, we were more than ready to sweep the covid-year away and start a fresh one. But at the same time, we were proud of what we made during the most difficult and extreme time. We can proudly say that we made it! Even though, it has been difficult time, we had the most amazing team spirit through out the lockdown, restrictions and curfew. When days got too heavy to handle, there was always our team spirit lifting us up.

PART 1: HSH RESCUE CENTER

HSH RESCUE CENTER

The primary goal of the organization is to have our own rescue center in Makongeni village. With help of volunteers the very first building of HSH Rescue Center, was started in January 2018. Since then, we have built seven buildings and opened different services to our center. However, the center as whole is still under construction.

As the heart of Home Street Home, the Rescue Center will physically combine the most needed services and high-quality expertise. The center will include rescuing facilities for both girls and boys, training center for girls, health care facility and day care for children with disabilities.

EXTENSION OF THE PROJECT LAND

Initially Home Street Home was operating without a center. After working for two years without a permanent location, we finally bought a piece of land in December 2017. Same time, we got other side of the land as a donation from family.

The project Land is in Makongeni village in Kwale county. It is close to the village center and a walking distance from the main road. The land has a unique shape of its own.

After realizing that the initial plan was not fitting the needs of the center, we decided to look for options of extending the land. In 2020 we extended the project land to fit the project needs and activities. We bought a piece from our neighbor and our supportive local family decided to donate another piece for us. With these two extensions, we are now able to proceed with our plans and create something special.

HSH RESCUE CENTER

HSH Rescue Center will operate as a temporary refuge for victims of exploitation, forced marriage, violence and girls escaping female circumcision. In action our Rescue Center can accommodate total of 50 children or youths on a time.

During the year of 2020, our volunteer team worked hard to ensure the progress of the construction of the rescue center. Our team continued with kitchen building, toilet building and dining hall. Currently, the finished rooms of the rescue center side are used as a storage, library & study room, office and health clinic.



HSH HEALTH CENTER

In future, our target is to build a health center to our center. We will build a compact, but efficient health center in connection with the HSH Rescue Center. The purpose of the HSH Health Center -project is to bring safe, high-quality health care services to people living in Makongeni area. The most important targets of the project are to offer 1) free childbirth for all pregnant moms in the area and 2) special support in maternity care.

The HSH Health Center will also offer services covering safe medication, fluid- and nutrition therapy, run family-centred nursing programs, distribute science-based health knowledge and facts, and further develop the local health care operations in collaboration with the other operators in the area.

In 2020, as a pilot program of HSH Health Center, we constructed and opened a health clinic room to our center. The aim of the program is to provide simple health care services for the neediest families. In addition, the program is also there to help us to collect data and knowledge about the local health care problems and challenges.

COMMUNITY OUTREACH: NASSARIAN VILLAGE

The availability of health care services is poor in rural areas in Kenya. Distance to the nearest hospital can be long, roads can be in poor shape and the transportation options expensive or hardly available. This means, people will easily miss appointments and during acute health crisis, leave home too late or not reach hospital at all.

As pilot program, in September 2020, we organized and undertook a health outreach to Nassarian community. Within half a day, over twenty people showed up for treatments. The aim of the outreach was to share health information, give out basic nursing services and collect data about the local health challenges in the area of Nassarian.

Our target is to organize more health outreaches in the rural areas in 2021.

KALEVALA TRAINING CENTER

Kalevala Koru was looking for a partner and a charity, whereas much of the grant as possible would go directly to the project. It was also important that the impact of the grant is as large as possible and that it can be measured. These were all fulfilled for the Home Street Home and Kalevala Training Center project. With knowledge and skill, together we can change the world.

During the spring and summer of 2020, with the funding of Kalevala Koru, we have built and established a training center for girls and young women. Kalevala Koru is responsible for financing the project and Home Street Home handles the operational side of the project. With the Kalevala Training Center, we can train vulnerable girls and young women. The courses are aimed at uneducated girls aged 16-25.



Girls are still at a disadvantage compared to boys. Girls' education is threatened by poverty, family attitudes and crisis situations. Cases of exploitation of girls, early pregnancies, forced marriages and cases of human trafficking remain common. In addition, in the daily lives of families, girls are placed more responsible for housekeeping, cooking, and caring for children, while boys can focus on their studies. In the evenings, the girls cook, do the dishes, and do the laundry, so the time available for homework is reduced. This leads to a decline in a girl's school performance and even dropping out of school.

KTC COURSE PROGRAM

The education areas of the Kalevala Training Center are part of the Kenyan education system. At the end of the courses, students can take a national final exam, after which they receive an official certificate of competence. We offer three different courses: Computer Packages, Salon & Hairdressing and Tailoring & Dressmaking. During the courses, students learn the basics of the fields in theory and practice. During the studies, competence is assessed and tested so that we can be sure that all students are keeping up. The teachers are six local hired teachers.

In addition to theory and practical skills, teaching will focus on entrepreneurial orientation and leadership themes. We want to encourage students to be entrepreneurial and coach them towards the future. Through motivational exercises, leadership lessons, and entrepreneurship themes, we aim to ensure that students are left with a variety of tools for the future.

CONSTRUCTION OF THE KALEVALA TRAINING CENTER

The Kalevala Training Center was built together with local experts and craftsmen. During the construction and furnishing phase, we employed more than 90 local unemployed young people, builders, carpenters, and artisans. All work steps were performed using local materials and work methods. We selected strong and long-lasting materials. The floor was tiled and the doors and window frames, as well as the furniture, were handcrafted from hardwood.



High-quality and modern tools were chosen as teaching equipment, which make modern learning possible. The laptops in the computer class were equipped with the latest software, and in addition to the manual Singers, multi-purpose electronic sewing machines were acquired for the tailoring class. All equipment, materials and tools were procured through local suppliers.

HSH LIBRARY & STUDY ROOM

In Makongeni primary there is approximately one schoolbook for every 5 to 8 students. This means that most children do not have the opportunity to revise at home or do homework. Home Street Home established a library and study room to Makongeni village. The idea is to offer all children the possibility to use schoolbooks and materials outside teaching hours.

The program has been active since 2017, but finally in November 2019, we were able to move our Library and Study room to the Center. Now there is fully furnished classroom with revision books, course books and novels. There are also special materials like geometrical sets, games and exercise books for kids to use.

During the covid19 pandemic, we arranged teaching and classes in the study room. Local university student organized classes and tuition for primary and secondary school students. In addition, we purchased new revision books, white boards, teaching and learning materials and other equipment.

HSH DAY CARE CENTER

HSH Day Care Center is a day care for children with special needs. The purpose of the project is to create a safe environment for children with special needs to learn, develop their skills and get professional support. In addition, the purpose is to allow their parents to work and do their daily routines, while their child is in caring hands. Our focus group for HSH Day Care Center is to help children with special needs in age between 3 months to 8 years from the area of Kwale County.



Day Care center will be constructed as a part of HSH Rescue Center. The building will include daycare and therapy facilities with cozy and child-friendly design and style. We want to create special place where children can learn, play and get excited. We will equip the day care with professional therapy equipment and materials to meet the need of the children. Rooms will be decorated with art, textures, and playfulness.

In December 2020, we started the foundation of the Day Care building. Our local experts and volunteers worked hard with brick work, backfilling and concrete work. Our target is to open the day care in 2021.

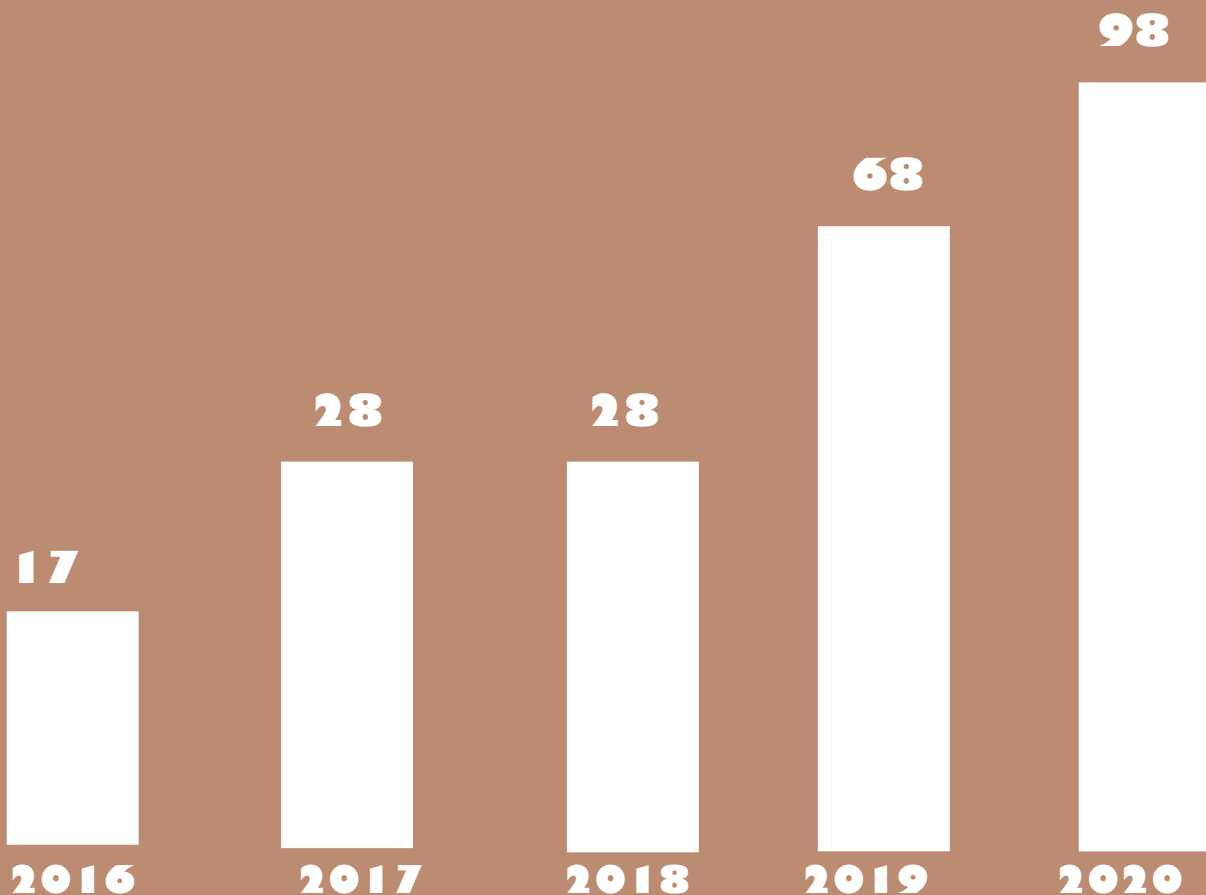
HSH TRUST

We believe that good education is the key to break the cycle of poverty and to create a better future for children and their families. Therefore, we promote education in the community by facilitating sponsorship for poor and vulnerable students and pupils who otherwise would not have a chance to attend.

When we invite people to sponsor a child, we are inviting you to invest in the future of our communities. For each child in the program we provide:

- School fees, school materials, supplies and uniform
- Regular monitoring of schoolwork and progress
- General education support as needed.
- Personal support in basic needs as needed
- Emergency support (including hospital costs or other emergency cases)

HSH TRUST DAYS 2020

In the end of 2019, our team developed the HSH Trust program, by creating a Trust Day - concept. The idea of the Trust Day is to invite all the children and their parents or guardians together. Trust Days are chance to share information, empower, collect data and share materials to all our HSH Trust families at the same time.

In 2020, we organized four Trust Days. One in January, one in September and two in December. In January we shared school uniforms and materials, discussed about the school year and collected information from each of the family/child.

Since covid19 came and changed the program completely, we decided to arrange special Trust Day in September. During the day we shared hygiene packages and collected information of how covid19 has affected the families and children.

In December we decided to have little faith and started preparations for the next year. First, we arranged Trust Day where we collected information of what the children need for school and took measurements for uniforms. Then, we organized second Trust Day where we shared uniforms, shoes and all school materials for 98 kids. Therefore, all children were prepared for the re-opening of the schools before the year was finished.

HSH HOME BASE CARE

HSH Home Base Care program benefits mostly vulnerable children and families. We are focusing on special cases like early pregnancies, forced marriages, school dropouts and child negligence. In our program we assist the family or a child to go through the challenges. It can mean providing basic needs: food, hygiene products or healthcare.

In 2020 HSH Home Base Care -program supported 33 people regularly. Additionally, we supported 48 people irregular.

CASE STORY

Mwaka's family

Mwaka is a 26 years old single mother of four children: 11 year old daughter and 9 and 6 year old sons and 10 months old baby. We met Marry after hearing her struggling case from a concerned teacher in Makongeni primary school who knew Mwaka from their home village Perani. Mwaka was 15 years old when she got her first child, she had to drop out from school and get married. She lived with the husband for five years then they separated after the husband became mentally challenged due to drugs and substance abuse.

It was December 2019, when we found Mwaka. She was then 6 months pregnant; all the kids were not in school and she was struggling to cover the basic needs of her children. We moved the family to Makongeni village where its easy for us to support them, we rented a house for them put all the kids to school and started to support the family with our home base care program.

HSH FEEDING PROGRAM

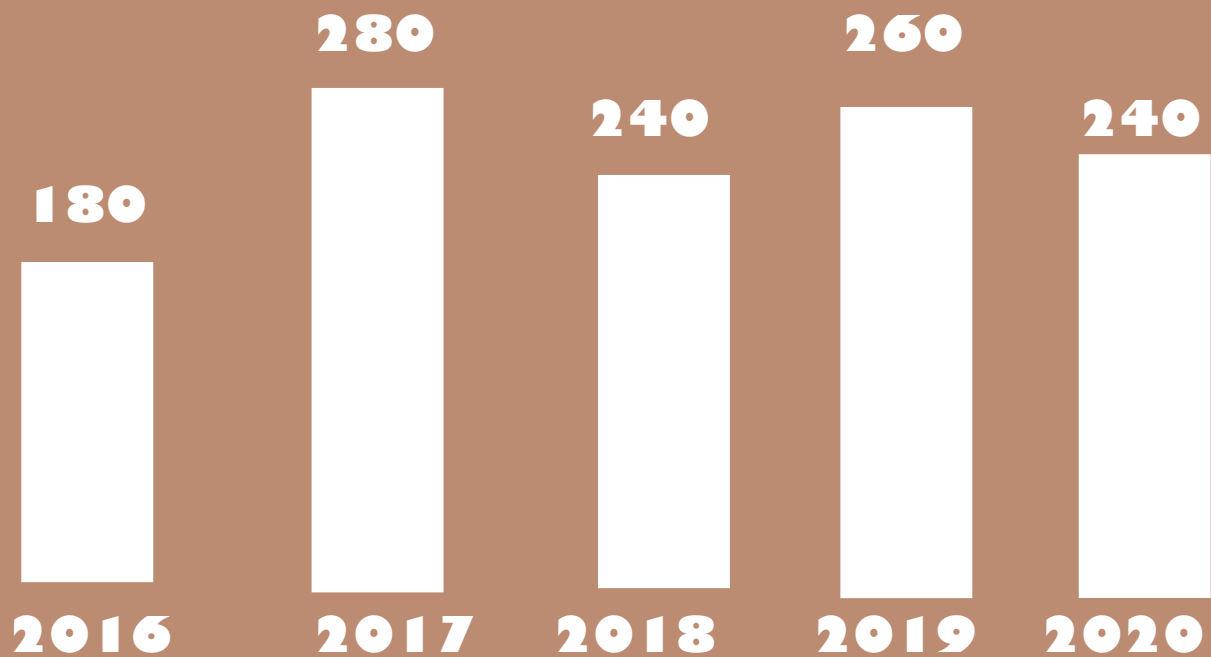
HSH Feeding Program gives infants an opportunity to stay concentrated in class without hunger. This is achieved through feeding the kindergarten school going children with nutritious porridge every morning-break at school. As a pilot project, it was started in Makongeni in 2016 and it is now on going. The project is hailed to be successful by the parents and teachers of Makongeni Pre-primary school.

Majority of the children in this area go to school without breakfast because of poverty. As a result, this project has contributed to improved concentration and activeness of the pupils during class time, and in turn better academic performance in the long-term.

In 2020 HSH Feeding program served only one term, from January to March. Because of covid19 pandemic, all the schools were closed, and children sent back home.

HSH VOLUNTEERING

We work as a team together with both local and international volunteers. We have hosted 102 international volunteers from 5 different countries. Our local team members are active youth who are passionate to work for their community.

We believe that 'Sharing is caring'. We can share our skills, knowledge, experience and stories together. That can make us wiser, kinder and stronger. It can connect us through different backgrounds, life-experiences, continents and cultures. It makes us humble and caring.

LOCAL VOLUNTEERING

2020 was amazingly active for local volunteering. When schools and offices were closed because of the pandemic, more and more youths were interested to join and volunteer with us. Our team grew with 17 new members. This makes it total of 34 local volunteers since starting our program.

INTERNATIONAL VOLUNTEERING

In the beginning of the year, we were expecting to have busy year with more than 60 international volunteers. When covid19 pandemic hit the world, most of the international volunteers and students cancelled or rescheduled their trips. The whole year changed. The Government of Kenya commanded lockdown and national curfew, no one could travel between April-July.

In August, the borders were reopened and step by step, our volunteers started to plan their trips. In the end we had total of 28 international volunteers during the whole year of 2020. Which makes it total of 102 international volunteers, from 5 different countries, since starting the program (2016).



VOLUNTEERING WITH HOME STREET HOME

“Last January (2020) when I had a break from my work as a consultant, I read a newspaper article about Viola and Home Street Home. I have been to Tanzania several times, and the idea of volunteering in Eastern Africa had teased me for years. The article and my totally empty calendar appeared to be a perfect match. Plus, at last, I found a person and an organization who responded to a 51-year-old woman who had no previous experience on volunteering in Africa. After the very first message (I think we had less than 5 messages totally!), everything happened quite fast. In the beginning of February, I arrived to Makongeni and spent almost two months in carrying sand and water, in chopping and laying coral bricks, in cutting palm trees, cooking porridge, sawing, varnishing, digging... The time I spent in Makongeni has been one of the most significant and rewarding experiences I have ever had. I witnessed the ultimate power of teamwork, trust, passion, targets, values and humanity. I learned a lot of the local culture, the strength of community and people. And I totally fell in love with the village. And the beach. And my host family. And chapati, mandazi, pilau and chai!!! I even learned to eat sitting on the floor, with fingers. Even spaghetti! I will be back.”

TEAM TRAININGS

In order to motivate, empower and enhance cohesion among the team members and volunteers, a series of trainings were organized in July and September 2020 at the HSH center. The trainings included First-Aid, occupational safety, leadership empowerment and volunteer team skills.



HSH INTERNSHIP: CHILDREN'S PLAYGROUP

With support from two interns from Finland and a local volunteer, HSH initiated a playgroup as a pilot project to test the feasibility of a center to host 3-year-old children where they can spend time during the day learning basic things as preparation to integrate the nursery or kindergarten school. On the period between January – March 2020, 11 children were welcomed two days per week at the HSH library which was transformed into a playroom equipped with playing materials. From 9:00 to 13:00, the kids were placed under the care of our two volunteers who spent time playing with them and looking after them with regular feeding pauses (porridge). These special games, created by the interns, were adapted to their intellectual development in order to prepare them for joining kindergarten the following year. The pilot project initially meant to run for a full year was however suspended until further notice due to the Covid19 pandemic.

HSH INTERNSHIP: EMERGENCY PLAN AND OCCUPATIONAL SAFETY TRAINING

The property, the environment and the people working and visiting its area are exposed to various security risks which can cause significant damage. Emergency planning, as well as instructing and training people in the case of an accident, are an important part of preparing for both daily and exceptional incidents and accidents. As a part of her internship, university student from Finland, organized and arranged a safety training and created KTC emergency plan, safety manual and other safety tools.

A two-part safety training was organized to increase staff safety awareness and to identify and prevent hazards, stressors, and risks. Home Street Home team members, volunteers, KTC teachers, cleaner and security guard took a part to the training.

Through practical exercises, team members learned to build a safety culture and in cooperation to carry out risk assessment in their own operating environment. In view of this risk assessment, an emergency plan was created for the property. In addition to the emergency plan, a safety manual was created. It contains easy-to-adopt instructions for dealing with anomalous situations. These include, for example, first aid instructions, emergency call instructions, evacuation instructions and operating instructions in the case of a fire or other emergency. In creating the materials, efforts have been made to consider the challenges regarding the security situation in Kenya and co-operation with the authorities by also creating internal crisis management instructions.



HSH THESIS WORK

FIRST AID FOR FAMILIES

Two nursing students from Häme University of Applied sciences, created a guide about children's first aid. The aim of the guide is to help families and to improve children's health. This guide is meant to be shared in Home Street Home's working area.



MOBILITY AND FUNCTIONING GUIDE FOR A CHILD WITH CEREBRAL PALSY DISABILITY

Three physiotherapy students created mobility and functioning guide for a child with cerebral palsy disability. The guide is already used in local CP-center. In addition, the guide will be used later in HSH Day Care Center. Plays in the guide are designed to improve balance, coordination, aerobic capacity, muscle strength, hand-eye coordination, proprioception and joint mobility. Visual and perceptual problems have been considered in the design of the plays. Basic motion models, for instance walking, jumping, throwing and kicking have been utilized in the design of the plays. Basic motion models serve as the basis for more complex movements to be learned. Also, important movements of upper extremities such as gripping, detaching, stretching and flexing

HSH HAKI KIT

Through the covid19 pandemic, during 2020, there was an increased number of early and teenage pregnancies, rapes and domestic violence cases in Kenya. After government of Kenya closed the schools, children and youth were left without safe haven. In long term, covid19 pandemic might undo decades of progress in child rights and put millions of girls at risk of violence, abuse and exploitation.

The aim of HSH Haki Kit program is to support the rights of children or youths in a case of any form of violence. This might be sexual abuse, physical or mental abuse, violence or any other form of child abusing. Our role is to facilitate and share information of reporting,

During 2020, we supported total of 25 cases of sexual abuses, early pregnancies and cases of domestic violence.

HSH GIRL'S CLASS

The aim of HSH Girl's Class program is to teach teenagers and youth about puberty, menstruation, hygiene, sex and pregnancy. During the class, the pupils will learn about importance of monitoring their menstruation, how to act during their periods and how to take care of their personal hygiene. We also talk about safe sex, STD's and how to say no, if someone is forcing for a sex. Idea of the classes is also to give an opportunity to the pupils to ask questions and talk about these topics openly.

After each of the classes, the girls will get one package of reusable sanitary towels. Package includes seven pieces of sanitary towels, one pair of underpants, soap, little plastic bag for dirty sanitary towel and short description how to use reusable sanitary towels. Everything packed on one colourful bag.

in the beginning of 2020, our village school had a high number of early pregnancy cases and home abortions. Young teenager girls started to establish home abortion for themselves by using different kind of life-threatening methods. Because of these incidents, we wanted to act. We decided to plan and create full new teaching package about the risks and danger of home abortion.

Our volunteer team planned, designed and trained simple course material for primary school pupils. First home abortion classes were supposed to be arranged in Makongeni primary school. While planning the schedule, covid19 pandemic started and effected our plans. Schools were closed Government restricted gatherings.

HSH FAMILY HOME

The aim of HSH Family Home is to renovate and build new homes for the families together with volunteers. The project has been conducted in Makongeni and Madongoni villages since 2017. The selected families have been poverty-stricken single-parent families with several children.

In 2020, we built two family homes. One family home was constructed for single-parent family and another one for three total orphans.

FUNDRAISING METHODS OF THE YEAR 2020

MEMBER- AND SPONSORSHIP PROGRAMS

Home Street Home member- and sponsorship programs are way to look for long-term supporters. Member-supporters are supporting monthly or annually organization's work. Sponsorship supporters are supporting monthly one child, family, or project. Supporters can be individuals, companies, or groups. During the year of 2020, HSH raised the number of sponsors and program supporters.

DONATIONS AND GRANTS

During the year of 2020, Home Street Home received the highest number of donations and one-time supports. Most of the donations were received from individuals.

PRODUCT SELLING

Product selling is simple fundraising method. During the year of 2020, we sold handmade bags, wallets, dolls, toys, coconut bowls, hair scrunchies, baskets and trays. Because of the pandemic, all the selling was done online.

COLLABORATIONS WITH COMPANIES, ORGANIZATIONS, OR GROUPS

Good collaboration can bring positive effect for both parties. In 2020, we started several collaborations with different companies and organizations. Through these collaborations, we started new projects and programs. (For example; Kalevala Training Center)

EXPENDITURES OF THE 2020

All the expenditures were recorded while working. If there were no recipes available, we used payment vouchers and payments sheets. Vouchers were used mainly to record payments like food/medical support, bricks, sand, gravel, or stones, which were brought by lorry and paid for the driver. Vouchers were also used for payments which were paid for individual person.

All the payment sheets and vouchers were signed by the people who received the payments and confirmed through HSH board members.

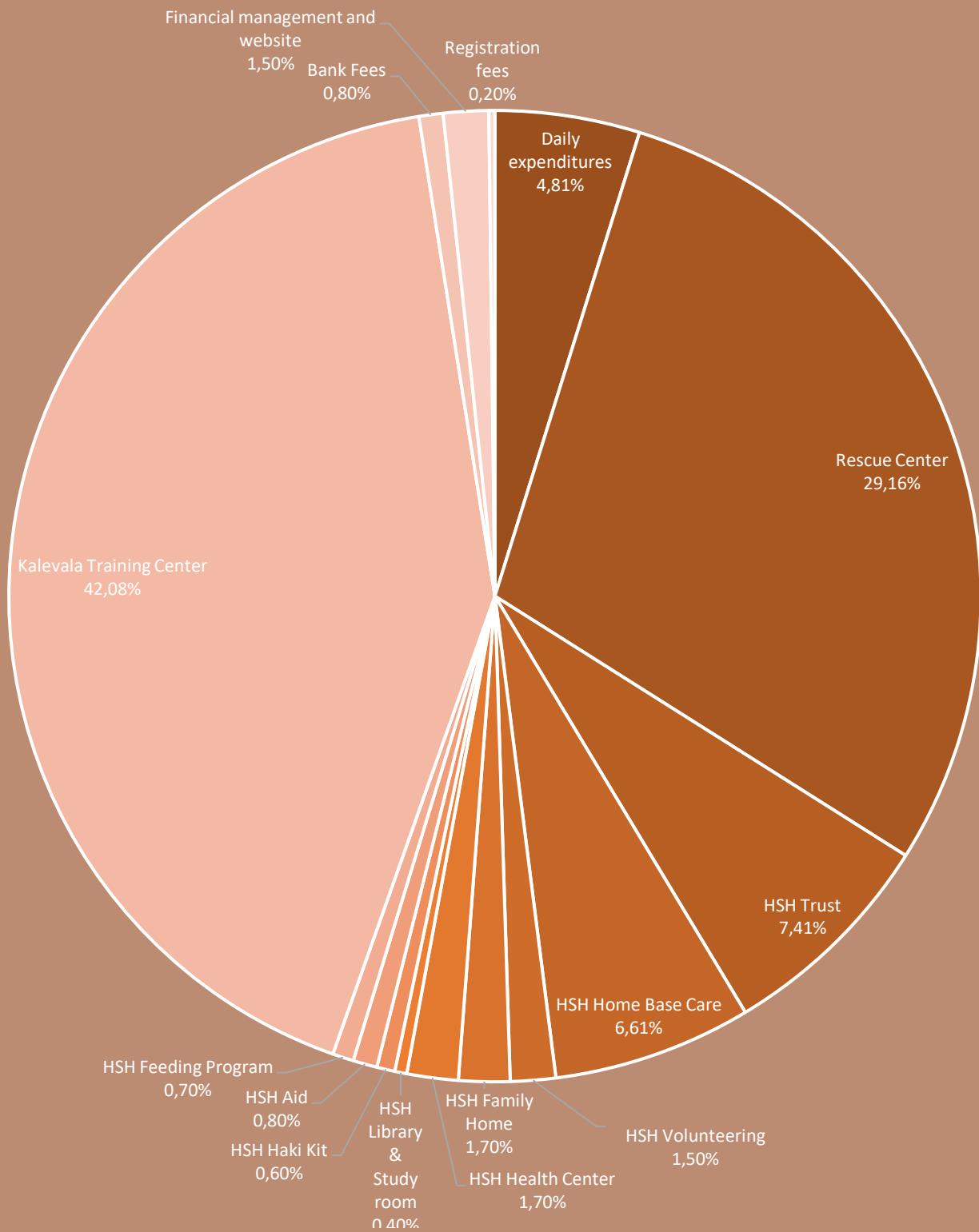
